### Access Requirements

This training is accessible to students who have a 2nd cycle university degree and who have an adequate knowledge of Latin, equivalent to at least the level of LFLTR1760 Introduction to Latin.

## Teaching method

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The courses make use of a variety of teaching techniques and strategies (lectures, group work, individual work, seminars, reading etc.) which help students to acquire the necessary skills. Certain courses also use e-learning techniques (provision of resources and exercises, teaching devices, collective sharing and assessment of work).

## Evaluation

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***The evaluation methods comply with the [regulations concerning studies and exams](#). According to the type of course, there are different forms of assessment. Certain courses have traditional oral and/or written assessments (which take place in the examination periods in January, June and August/September), while seminars involve student participation throughout the semester and the assessment of individual work. Further details on the assessment method are given at the beginning of each course.

To obtain a student's average, the grades awarded for each course unit are weighted by their respective credits.
